RED OAK -- The Northern Nash Boys Basketball team is off to a hot start in its 2025-26 campaign, picking up a pair of victories over East Wake last week en route to a 5-0 start to the season.

Fighting Knights wrapped up the second leg of

their homeand-home against the Warriors on Friday evening,

securing a fifth-straight double-digit victory at 72-61 just a few days removed from beating East Wake on the road, 62-48 on December 1.

"I am pleased that we can put the ball in the basket effectively most of the time," said 12thyear Northern Nash head coach Henry Drake of his team's early success, with some changes coming to the Knights' roster on the horizon.

With football season now over at Northern, a slew of student-athletes are shifting their focus from the gridiron to the hardwood, with six new

STANHOPE -- Southern Nash's bestever volleyball season closed with five Ladybirds -- and one coach -- being saluted by the Big East Conference.



And with so many underclassmen contributing this fall, the NNHS gridiron program is showing no signs of slowing down.

the players joining

Knights' bench. Terrance Saunders Jr., KhaNydre Wardrett, Kamren Freeman, Gehrig Miller, Jah'Marzea Williams and Chase Morgan have each transitioned to the basketball court with the football slate now wrapped up, creating a deeper, more talented team for Drake and his staff to manage.

"We have gone back to the drawing board to learn the team all over again," remarked Drake, with a chunk of those players seeing their first action of the year in Friday's win over East Wake.

This roster shift isn't the first for this year's Northern Nash squad, though, with the offseason headlines for the program dominated by the departure of CJ Rosser, the team's star from its two previous seasons.

Rosser, one of the nation's top players in the class of 2027 that has garnered attention from the nation's top collegiate programs, announced over the summer that he was transferring to Southeastern Prep in Florida, just weeks after he helped the Team USA U16 squad win the Gold Medal in the FIBA Men's AmeriCup.

"The team has handled this very well," stated Drake of Rosser's decision. "They have all stepped up collectively and will continue to do so."

One of the biggest pieces to the Knights' shuffled puzzle has come in the form of a firstyear player, as freshman Quantay James has been a key contributor for Northern so far.

A 6'5 forward, James entered this week averaging 14 points per outing, with his young career highlighted by a pair of 19-point performances in each game against East Wake.

"He accepts criticism well and gives 100-percent in practice," said Drake of James. "Quantay has proven that he's a varsity player and can contribute to the team."

James is only shy of senior point guard Christian Barnes in scoring, with Barnes a hair above James at 14.3 points per game. Barnes is one of four Knights currently averaging double figures in scoring, with junior Kingston Little just short of James at 13.8 points per game while senior Jamiere Harris is rounding that group out at 10.2

points per outing. Perhaps the biggest surprise for Northern has been the emergence and improvement of sevenfooter Chris Silver, who is putting up over nine points per game while snagging a team-best 8.6 rebounds per game as well. Silver averages less than four points and four rebounds per game a season ago, doubling his production from his junior season thus far.

"I think he will continue to get better on both sides of the ball," said Drake, with the team's defense looking to be an early strength as the Knights sift through its offseason slate.

Northern Nash was expected to play Roanoke Rapids on Monday until the game was postponed due to weather, and moved to 6-0 on the year with a 65-62 defeat of Nash Central on Tuesday night.

The Fighting Knights now have just one game left before kicking off conference play December 19 at Fike, with a Saturday, December 13 neutral site matchup against Eastern Wayne on deck.

Whitaker excelled so much that he was tabbed as the Quad County Conference's Defensive Player of the Year while helping the Bulldogs reach the state playoffs.

"It was a situation where we just kind of needed Jayden on defense," Lee said. "He responded to the challenge.

"Not only did he play well on both sides of the ball, but he was also a leader for our team. He was a captain all season and was the only senior offensive lineman.

"He'll end up playing in college somewhere -- it's just a matter of finding the right fit."

And Whitaker's prep football career isn't quite over yet as he will participate in the prestigious East-West All-Star Football Game later thismonth in Greensboro.

Bunn's Jessiel Romero was tabbed as the QCC Coach of the Year after leading the Wildcats to the regular season championship.
